 Where? City and County of Broomfield Auditorium and Library parking lot

 How? Tune your FM radio dial to 90.5. Vehicles will need a functioning FM radio and the concert will also be played over loudspeakers. Starting at 6:30, Rusty Collins will be on the radio with interesting information about the Broomfield Symphony Orchestra (BSO), the City and County of Broomfield and other fun factoids plus assistance in getting parked, so turn on your radio when you arrive at the park.

 FISH Donations? Please leave them with the greeters at the entrance to the parking lot when you arrive. Thank you!

 Parking? Driving speed limit in the parking lot is 5 mph. There will be cones in every other parking space. Please park in a space that does not contain a cone. The cone placement has been designed to allow everyone the best ability to see. Please do not move the cones! Please park with your windshield facing the Auditorium and stay in your car! If you are driving a taller vehicle, please try to park in the last 2 rows so that the smaller cars can see.

 Bathroom? Please take care of this business before you come. For emergencies, there is a restroom in the Library. Only one person in the restroom at a time, please, and if you are waiting, please practice physical distancing of at least 6 feet. Please access the doors of the Library by walking to either side of the performing groups which will be set up on the sidewalk in front of the Auditorium near the street. Please do not walk through the groups performing. The restrooms will be cleaned at the start of the event. Sanitation products will be available, but there will be no cleaning between visits. If you leave your car, please wear a mask.

 Can I bring food to the concert? Yes, absolutely! Feel free to bring your own snacks, food, and non-alcoholic beverages to enjoy during the show. Please consume your food inside your vehicle.



🕒🕒 How long? 60 minutes of music have been programmed with no intermission.

🚗 Can I bring chairs or blankets to sit outside my car? No, all attendees must stay inside their vehicles unless needing to use the restroom. No out of car standing or seating is allowed. Convertibles may have the tops down.

✓✓ Program? There will not be a printed program for this evening's event to make it contactless. Please download the program from the BSO website, access it from the BSO website on your cell or sit back and enjoy the announcers as they guide you through the concert.

🚗🚗 How to show your appreciation in your car? Honk your horn!! The performers will thank you as it's weird to be playing to windshields.

🚗🚗 How to Exit? Please be patient. Vehicles will be directed out starting with the back row. All cars will leave by driving forward out of their parking place, except the first row. Please listen on the radio for help getting everyone out safely! Driving speed in the parking lot is 5 mph. Please do not leave until the lights in the parking lot are on.
